General Description of Services:

The Anti-Violence Partnership of Philadelphia (AVP) addresses the cycle of violence within our community by providing victim services and therapeutic counseling to those impacted by crime and violence prevention programs to children within our schools, as well as working to effect community change to promote better services to crime victims and co-victims of homicide.

The Families of Murder Victims (FMV) Program is physically housed within the Philadelphia District Attorney's Office and provides a wide array of services to co-victims (surviving family members and friends of homicide victims) including: court accompaniment, criminal justice system information and advocacy, supportive counseling, support groups, assistance with crime victim compensation, and crisis intervention.

Transitional Services, which works in collaboration with the Medical Examiners Office (MEO) and provides immediate crisis support to families during their visit to the MEO. Also, families are educated about other services such as Crime Victims Compensation, counseling services and criminal justice assistance immediately following the incident (homicide). Support groups for adults, teens and children are hosted twice per month.

ANTI-VIOLENCE PARTNERSHIP OF PHILADELPHIA (AVP)

The West/Southwest Victim Services (W/SW VS) Program is located in the West Philadelphia community and provides comprehensive support to victims in that area including: court accompaniment and advocacy at preliminary hearings, emotional support, assistance in filing for crime victim compensation, crisis intervention, and referrals to other community and city resources.

Licensed therapists staffing AVP's Counseling Center provide individual, family, and group therapy to adult and child victims and co-victims, as well as to child witnesses to domestic violence, at several sites throughout the city, including AVP's main office in the Art Museum area, the West/Southwest Victim Services office, the Criminal Justice Center, and other community sites.

Other AVP programs include:

SAVE (Student Anti-Violence Education) Program, provides training in violence prevention techniques and strategies to children and youth in Philadelphia's urban schools and community sites.

Service and assistance is provided to any one who has been sexually abused by a member of the clergy or any individual representing the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. The Victim Assistance Program offers outpatient counseling and psychiatric care to adult victims of sexual abuse. Transportation assistance and child care costs are also reimbursed in order to facilitate participation in outpatient counseling. Victim Assistance Coordinators assist in securing inpatient care and addiction counseling when needed. Case management services are provided to assist survivors in securing emergency financial assistance, vocational training, housing, and other programs and services. Victim Assistance Coordinators are available to provide on going support to survivors of sexual abuse as well as to process initial reports of abuse to the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. Victim Assistance Coordinators will facilitate reports to law enforcement authorities and Child Line.

The Bilingual Domestic Violence Program is committed to providing a safe space for victims/survivors of domestic violence. Specific services include: a 24-hour collaborative hotline (1-866-SAFE-014), crisis intervention in-person and via phone, ongoing individual and group counseling, court accompaniment, and the Sheila Brown Transitional Housing Program. Crisis, ongoing counseling, and advocacy are provided in a variety of settings including Adult Philadelphia Probation Department, St. Christopher's Hospital for Children, and the Riverside Correctional Facility. The BDVP provides education and training about domestic violence for youth, community groups, professionals, workplaces and congregations. H.O.P.E provides behavioral health assessments and continued therapy for consumers 60 and older who are homebound and cannot leave their home to receive such services. H.O.P.E also provides the above services to consumers who are under the age of 60 and are homebound because of physical limitations. Although our services are concentrated in the northeast and far northeast sections of Philadelphia, when appropriate we may serve consumers in other parts of Philadelphia County.

SAFE is a program for children and adolescents who have been sexually abused. Services include: assessment of propriety for treatment, family therapy, individual talk and play therapy, psychiatric evaluation and medication management, assistance with case management issues (e.g., transportation, linkages with other social services), and coordination with other levels of care.

General Description of Services:

The mission of the Good Shepherd Mediation Program (GSMP) is to encourage peace, reconciliation, and social justice through the use of mediation and other constructive conflict resolution processes. GSMP works to empower Philadelphia community residents to creatively search for meaningful and lasting solutions to their conflicts without resorting to crime or violence.

With the use of a trained neutral third party, GSMP's Restorative Justice Initiative provides four (4) models of dialogue to allow victims a voice in a just process. Voluntary services that include Victim-Offender Conferencing, Restorative Group Conferencing, Healing Circles and Family Group Decision Making allow victims to increase their knowledge of the offense, hold the offending person directly accountable, build upon their support system and the opportunity to heal from their victimization. A victim's choice of services is dependent on their level of interest to include the offending person in the process.

GSMP's Community Mediation services accept referrals for neighborhood, small claims, petty crimes, housing and employment disputes. GSMP's Family Passages Initiative provides mediation services that include Parent-Youth Mediation, Divorce, Custody and Partnership Dissolution. Additional mediation services include Elder Mediation, Multi-party Mediation, Truancy Mediation, Conflict Coaching and Meeting Facilitation. The Address Confidentiality Program (ACP) provides eligible victims of domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking with an alternative mailing address in order to protect a new home, work or school address from their perpetrators. This address may be used to fulfill the address requirements of court and government records, such as drivers' licenses, library cards, traffic tickets, vehicle registrations, employment security, school records, workers' compensation and court petitions

The program has two basic parts. First, the ACP provides a substitute address for victims who have moved to a new location unknown to their perpetrator. The second part of the program provides participants with a free first-class confidential mail forwarding service.

Victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, and persons who live in the same household as a participant may apply for ACP participation. A parent or guardian can apply to the program on behalf of a minor or individual who is incapacitated.

A private non-private agency, the Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) was founded in 1989 with the cooperation of the Department of Human Services (DHS), the Police Department, The Office of the District Attorney, Children's Hospital and various mental health agencies to provide a child-friendly facility for the coordinated intervention and investigation of child sexual abuse cases in the City of Philadelphia. Through multi-disciplinary teamwork, the Alliance provides a forensic interview process with trained forensic interviewers as well as victim services to families. The goal of the Alliance is to reduce the possibility of multiple interviews of children in the investigation of child sexual abuse, and make the investigation process itself less traumatic for the family.

The Philadelphia Children's Alliance offers educational and supportive services for child victims and their non-offending caretakers. The victim service staff acts as additional support to the family, orienting clients to the multiple systems, providing referrals for treatment, providing individual counseling to parents/caregivers, assistance with crime victim's compensation, assistance with courts school, and staff is available to accompany families to preliminary hearings and trials.

The Philadelphia Children's Alliance also offers a series of support and educational groups parents/caregivers. The Alliance also offers a child's self esteem activity group that operates in conjunction with the parent group. The group runs from ten to twelve weeks once in the spring and once in the fall. The groups are open to all agency clients as well as families caring for a sexually abused child(ren). The groups are free of charge and the Alliance provides refreshments and transportation.
